Certified Renovator Training- RRP Training

EPA-Accredited training provider Mustardseed Cultural and Environmental Services, LLC (MCE) course follows the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)/ U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) training curriculum to train renovation, repair and painting contractors on how to work safely in housing with lead-based paint and comply with EPA's Renovation, Repair, and Painting (RRP) Rule, and HUD's Lead Safe Housing Rule.

The Audience: Beginning April 22, 2010, Renovators, remodelers, painters, maintenance personnel, and any other workers removing or modifying more than 6 sq.ft. of painted surfaces in a pre-1978 dwelling. After completion of this course, they will have EPA certification as a Certified Renovator, which will satisfy HUD requirements for interim controls training in Federally-assisted target housing.

Initial Certified Renovator Training- \$150.00 Paid pre-registration required

The initial Certified Renovator Training class length is instruction 8-hours, with 8 modules that cover: lead-based paint health risks, regulations, preparation of work areas, methods of dust control, clean-up, recordkeeping and hands-on activities. Each student will receive a training manual and a cleaning verification card. A 70% passing score is required to receive a photo id certification card. Refresher Certified Renovator Training-\$95.00 Paid pre-registration required**

The MCE Refresher Certified Renovator Training class length is instruction 4-hours, with 7 modules that cover: lead-based paint health risks, regulations, preparation of work areas, methods of dust control, clean-up, recordkeeping and hands-on activities. Each student will receive a training manual and a cleaning verification card. A 70% passing score is required to receive a photo id certification card. Minimum class size is 6 and the maximum class size is 20.
